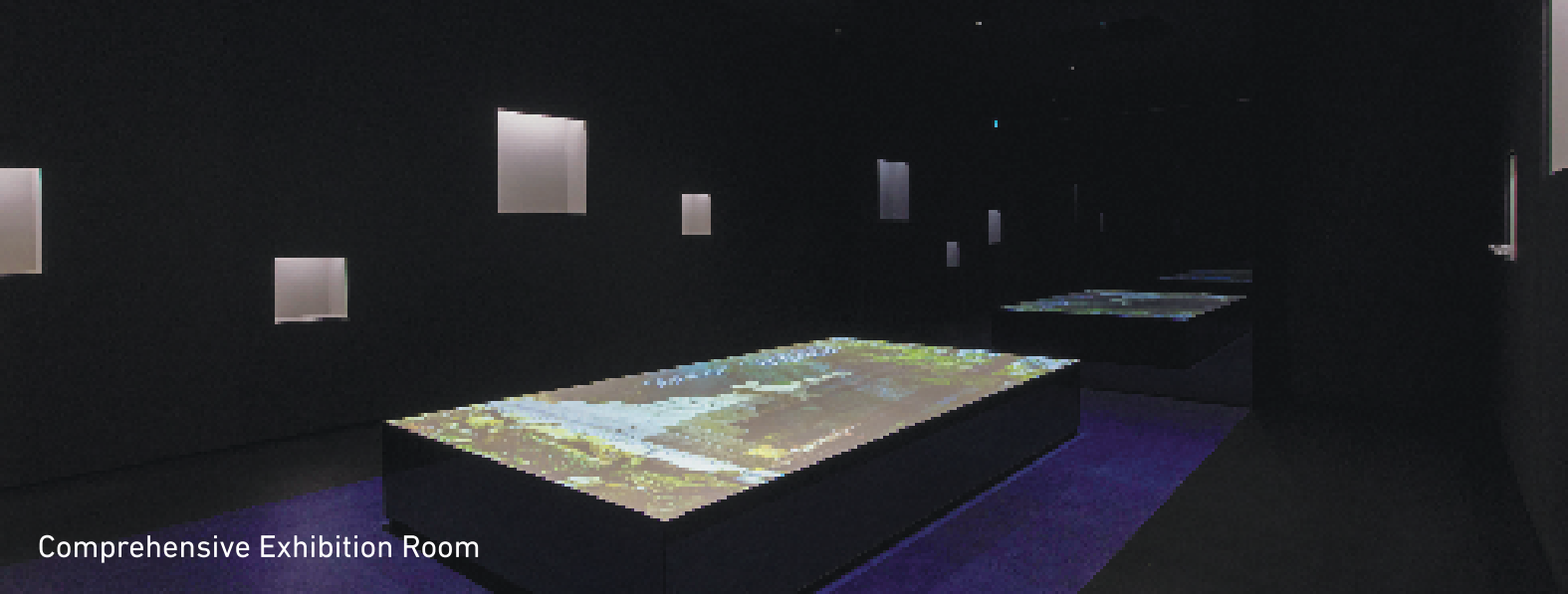


Facility Overview

Entrance Hall

With glass walls that stretch from the floor to the 16-meter-high ceiling, the entrance hall provides an open, spacious atmosphere with a view of the Kaneishi Castle Gate and the landscape surrounding the museum.

The museum's permanent exhibition area is divided into five rooms: a comprehensive exhibition room, three rooms covering Tsushima's ancient, medieval, and early modern eras, and one covering the modern and contemporary periods. Exhibits analyze Tsushima from an economic perspective and detail the island's sea-based activities, shedding light on the comings and goings of Mono (matter), Hito (human), and Koto (things) in Tsushima.

Exhibition Policy

The museum strives to create exhibits that...

Enable visitors to learn about the exchange between Tsushima and other regions of East and Southeast Asia, such as the Korean peninsula and mainland Japan.

Illustrate the transition from the ancient to the modern period.

Impart teach visitors the value of cultural assets to help ensure they are passed on to future generations.

Special Exhibition Room 1

Special Exhibition Room

There are two special exhibition rooms, which can be used individually or together in line with the objective of the exhibition or event. Special Exhibition Room 1 has no display cases or other fixtures that are permanently attached to the floor. Two walls of the Special Exhibition Room 2 have 4-meter high built-in wall display cases where large items can be exhibited.

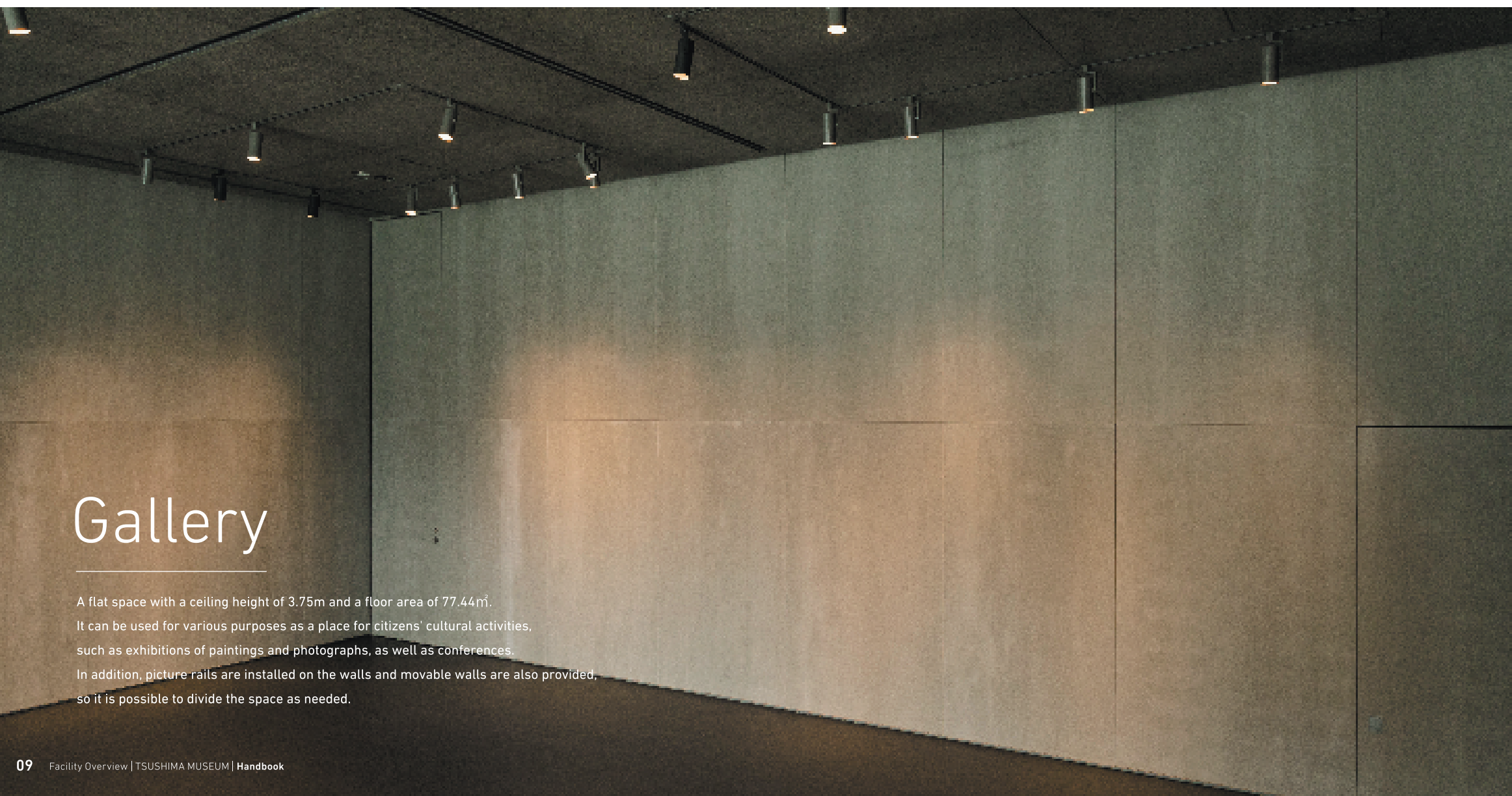

In addition to lectures hosted by the museum, we also exhibit natural history materials. You can use desks and chairs as needed in the space according to your needs.



Gallery

A flat space with a ceiling height of 3.75m and a floor area of 77.44m². It can be used for various purposes as a place for citizens' cultural activities, such as exhibitions of paintings and photographs, as well as conferences. In addition, picture rails are installed on the walls and movable walls are also provided, so it is possible to divide the space as needed.



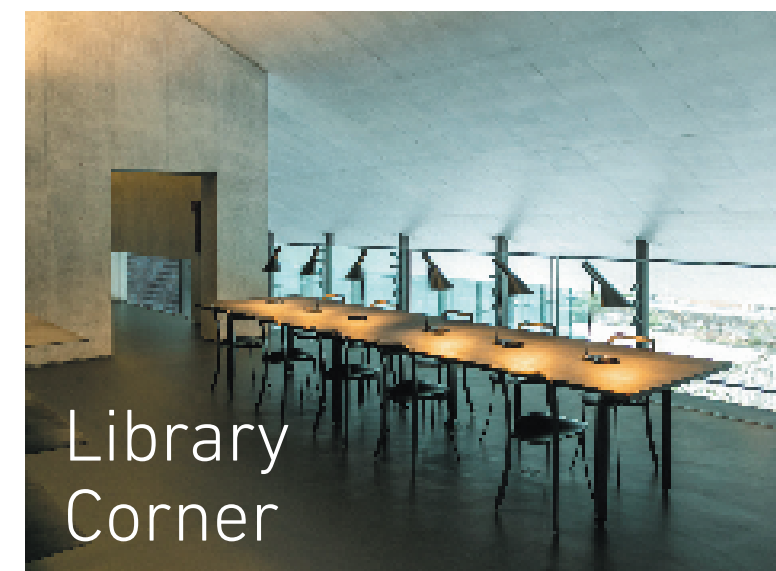
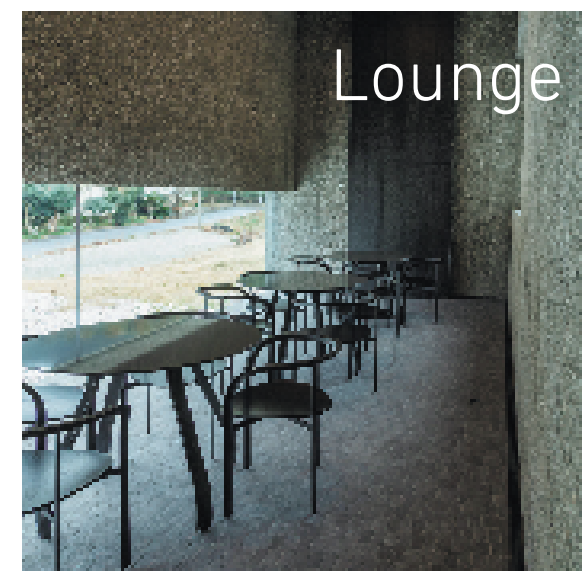
Entrance Terrace

At the entrance terrace, located at the main entrance of the museum, you will be welcomed by a sign in the shape of the museum's logo. The motif of this sign is the "counterfeit seal" used in the "forgery of national letters" of the Tsushima Domain, which was in charge of Korean diplomacy. Beyond that is the all-glass entrance that connects the inside and outside of the museum.



Museum Shop

It is a place that conveys the charm of Tsushima and the museum and connects Hito(people) and Mono(things). We sell exhibition catalogs, collection materials, and goods with original designs as motifs. You can meet new Mono(things) depending on the season, such as goods that match special exhibitions.

Storage Room

The museum has four storage rooms capable of storing artifacts and other items over a long period of time in pristine condition to ensure that valuable cultural assets are passed on to future generations. The rooms are equipped with air-conditioning systems to maintain constant environmental conditions inside, and are humidity-controlled, insulated, and airtight to minimize the effects of the external environment. The temperature and humidity of each storage room can be adjusted to suit different items, enabling them to be stored in their optimal environment. The storage area consists of Antechamber 2 and 3 and Storage Room 1 to 4, and is equipped with specialized highly fire-resistant, theft-proof doors.

There is a fumigation chamber where items are fumigated to protect the storage rooms from pest damage and ensure the items are kept in a safe environment, and also the Temporary Storeroom and the Antechamber 1 where items can be stored temporarily.

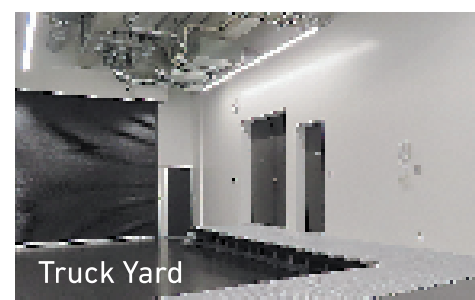

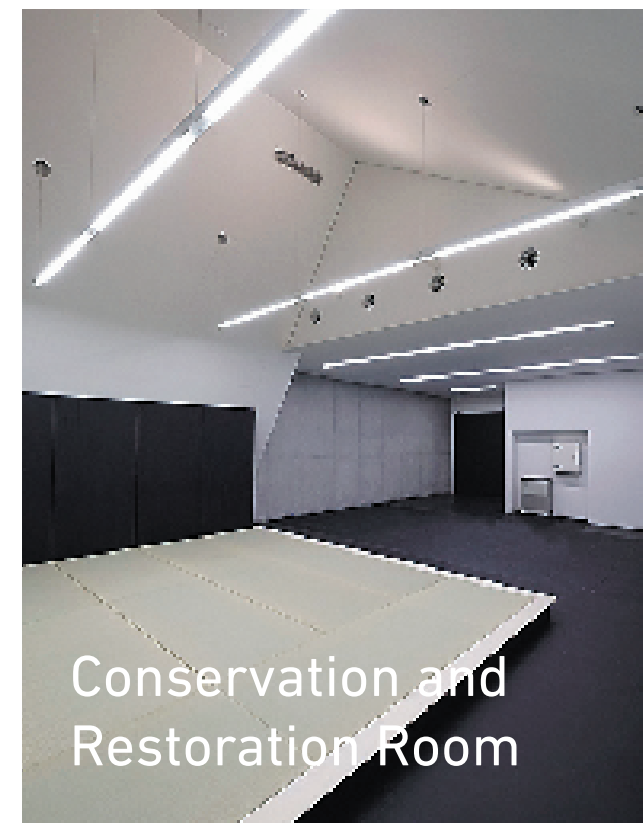

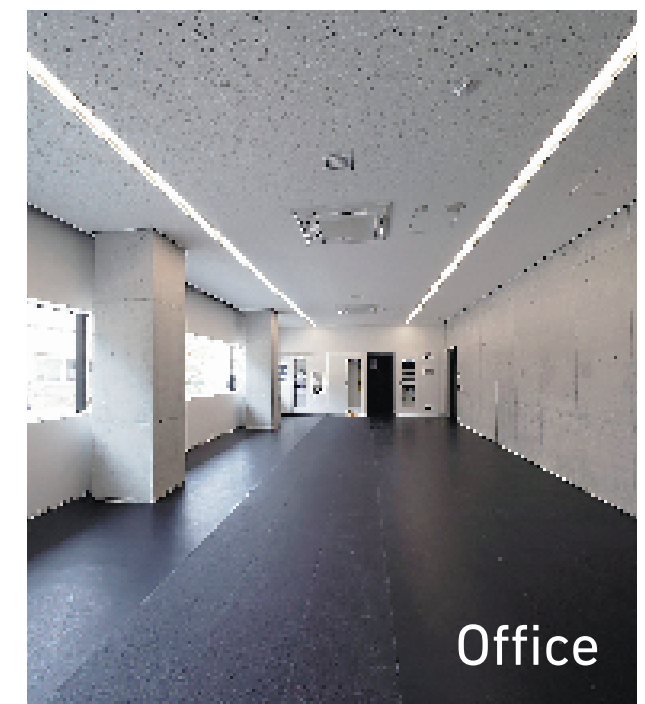

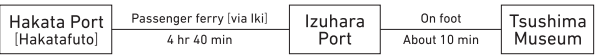

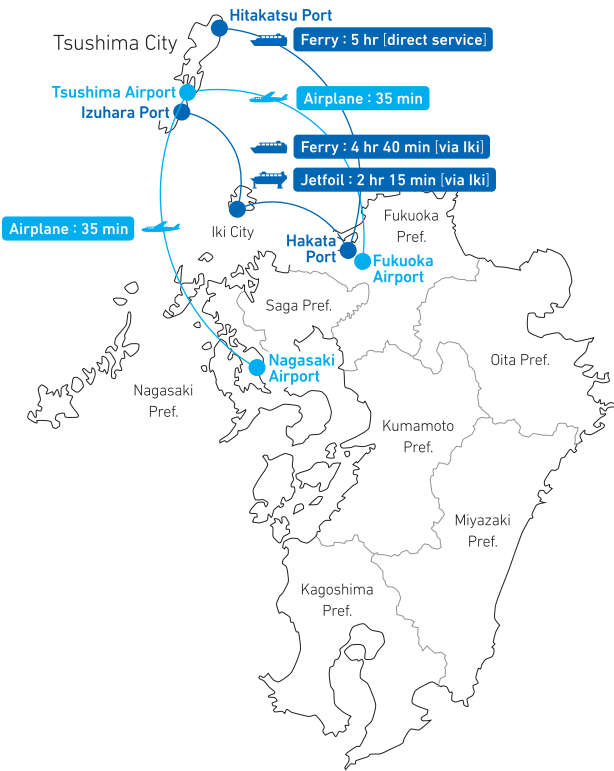

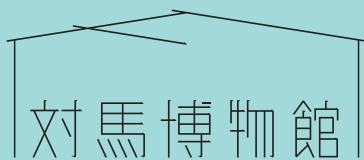
